## A REFRESHING SENSE OF PURPOSE

A sense of purpose is what fashions the intentions that breathe through all activities of a person or group. The purpose is what determines that which will not be left out when there are too many things clamoring for time and resources. The focus of purpose may be what sustains a person through difficulty or encourages him in the wake of disappointment.

Christ is our example of the refreshing power of a sense of purpose. There are a number of sayings in the New Testament that indicate not only that he was clear about his mission, but also that it was this sense which clarified his choices and strengthened his efforts.

- “She will bear a son, and you will call his name Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins” (Matt. 1:21).
- “For the Son of Man came to seek and to save the lost” (Lk. 19:10).
- “Now is my soul troubled. And what shall I say? ‘Father, save me from this hour?’ But for this purpose I have come to this hour. Father, glorify your name” (Jn. 12:27-28).
- “If anyone hears my words and does not keep them, I do not judge him; for I did not come to judge the world but to save the world” (Jn. 12:47).
- “The saying is trustworthy and deserving of full acceptance, that Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners, of whom I am the foremost” (1 Tim. 1:15).

Our Lord was in the world to save people from the terrible work of sin. That purpose was with him as he went about doing good, as he taught people how to live and preached the gospel of the kingdom everywhere, as he compassionately engaged the humble and courageously dealt with the proud, and as he gave himself up for us all. It is the sense that enabled him to keep his bearings amidst the crowds and critics and constant calls for help.

When our own spirits need refreshing, a renewed sense of his purpose for us might help us more than anything else. “God our Savior...desires all people to be saved and to come to the knowledge of the truth” (1 Tim. 2:3-4). He has entrusted to his children the proclaiming of his promises of life in Christ Jesus our Savior (Tit. 1:2-4). The intention of fulfilling that purpose must breathe through all that we do.

A refreshing sense of purpose will move us to excellence in our teaching program, loving kindness in our efforts to do good, vision in our efforts to faithfully pass along the word of life, affectionate acceptance in our dealings with one another, grateful praise and generosity when we assemble as the church, and a spirit of hope in all circumstances. Even more, it will make us like Christ!

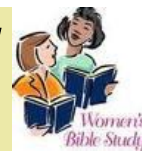
