## "By What Authority?"

*Most of us can see the need for submitting to the proper authorities in our daily lives. Someone must exercise authority in government, on the job, at school, and even in the games we play.*

*Authority is also of vital importance in our spiritual lives. People often try to justify their religious practices by what they think, or by what their preacher said, or by what others do. All such standards are unreliable and doomed to failure. In spiritual matters there is only one safe authority: the word of God. Without the authority of God, religious activities are useless.*

*For example, **faith without the authority of God's word is mere superstition.** It is unfortunate that so many in our world have been led to think that all that matters is whether one believes. The real question is whether what one believes is true! Bible faith must be based upon what God's word says (Rom. 10:17), and souls are purified through obedience to the truth (1 Peter 1:22).*

***Hope without the authority of the scriptures is only a wish.** Many people wish for things they have no real reason to expect. Bible hope, on the other hand, is expecting something because God's word promises it. A Christian can take the Word and give a reason for his hope (1 Peter 3:15). He will have learned what God promises in His word and will have met God's conditions. One whose hope is not based upon truth is of all men most to be pitied (cf. 1 Cor. 15:19).*

***Love without the guidance of the scriptures is empty sentiment.** Whatever is not guided by God's word cannot really be love for God. Jesus, for example, said, "If you love me, you will keep my commandments" (John 14:15). Love is not just a feeling. It is a commitment to obey the Lord in how we serve Him and in how we treat others. John wrote, "For this is the love of God, that we keep his commandments" (1 John 5:3).*

*Jesus was once asked, "By what authority are you doing these things?" (Matt. 21:23). All of us ought to examine our convictions and practices, asking ourselves the same question. Having God's authority is the difference between being a Christian and merely being religious.*

## A SAD LOOK AT WHAT ONCE WAS
