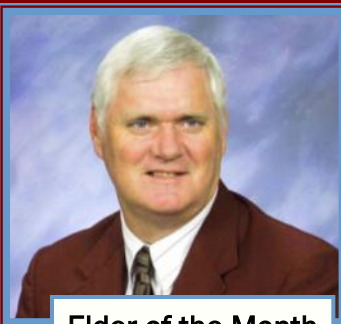
Welcome Visitors

"GIVING ACCOUNT OF OURSELVES"

Jesus, in giving the great commission (Matt 28:19-20; Mark 16:15-16) not only informs Christians of the importance of sharing the gospel with all that we know and meet, but also reveals the absolute necessity which is placed on those who have heard the gospel and their willingness to respond or not to respond to it. One may be very diligent in telling the world about Jesus - he may even give hours and hours of his time in working with others in an effort to win them to the Lord - but when all is said and done, every person must understand that he or she will, in the judgment, be accountable for their own soul.
