Her brothers and sisters here were present as her family remembered her, and served her family afterward, as Margaret did for many families for decades. That, friends, is what our work is all about. It is no small thing. It is about life.

Most importantly, we are meeting today in the interest of that which is "life indeed" through worship and teaching and encouraging each other in the faith.

These are the moments that make me ask myself whether I am ready for life.

WHAT A FRIEND WE HAVE!

Recently I received a greeting card from a boyhood friend whom I had known since I was 5 years old. Since then, other than our high school days together, I had seen him probably less than five times in the 76 years of our friendship. I must confess that I was pleasantly pleased and surprised to receive his card. This set me to thinking of the real value of friendship and, you know, the Bible informs us of this so often. "A man that hath friends must show himself friendly; and there is a friend that sticketh closer than a brother" (Prov. 18:21). Another passage from the Proverbs adds further dimension to the richness of friendship: "A friend loveth at all times" (17:17). One more divine message if you please: "Thine own friend, and thy father's friend, forsake not" (Prov. 27:10). My suggestion concerning our friends is that we do all we possibly can to keep them.
